

How to Select a Brush

- 1** Accelerate your art and your business by working with tools that allow you to perform at the top of your ability. One of the most important investments a nail tech can make is in your brush. Look for the highest quality brush available.
- 2** The best brushes will spring or snap back after being bent, while lesser quality brushes will hold a slight bend at the tip. Kolinsky is the highest quality and most valuable hair used in an artist brush. Look for a manufacturer that offers brushes made of 100% kolinsky versus kolinsky-sable blends.
- 3** Choose a brush that allows for sculpting versatility; a flat oval-style brush allows the artist the ability to flatten the body during product application as well as roll the tip to a fine point for defining dramatic smile lines and creating french alternatives.
- 4** When deciding which size is best, find a brush that allows for precise product control and consistent mix ratio. A #8 is the perfect size. It allows technicians to pick up enough liquid to sculpt nails of any size or design.
- 5** Look for a brush that offers key features such as an ergonomic design offering even weight distribution and perfect balance, as well as a built-in cover to protect brush when not in use.
- 6** For unsurpassed craftsmanship and longevity, always select a brush that has been hand-made and not milled.
- 7** An artist-quality brush partnered with a high-performance product will allow you to create nails that can handle something tougher than world championship: day-to-day life in a nail salon.
